
There will be two opportunities to hear Rebecca. One will be held on **Thursday**, **April 13**, **2023**, **10:00am-2:30pm** at the Cloverleaf Hall, 600 NW 1st, Enterprise, Oregon for **professional and service providers**. This training for professionals will present information on how to properly identify and respond to child victims of these abuses.

Rebecca will also be offering a community awareness presentation of "Not in Wallowa County" for students (recommended 7th through 12th grade) and adults to learn to recognize, intervene, and prevent human trafficking in Wallowa County. This **community event** will be held on Thursday, **April 13, 2023** Enterprise High School, Enterprise, Oregon. The event will begin at 5:00 – 5:30pm with a light dinner served in the cafeteria. At 5:30pm, parents can checkin their children for child-friendly activities and supervision in the little gym during event. The presentation will begin at **6:00pm** in the gymnasium.
