Summer Lunch Programs In Your Community

The Summer Food Service Program also known as "Summer Meals" is available in hundreds of communities throughout Oregon, offering free meals and snacks to ALL kids 1-18. Community summer meal programs are open to all families without paperwork, income verification, and regardless of immigration status. To receive a meal, kids can just drop in during a site's designated meal times. Many programs also offer fun activities so kids can stay active and keep learning.

Locations of Summer Lunch Sites:

- ◆ Call 2-1-1 and an operator can help you find a site in your area and provide you information about that site.
- ◆ Text "Food" or "Comida" to 304-304; you will be prompted to enter an address and will be texted back a list of sites near you.
- ◆ Use the USDA Meals for Kids Map following the instructions below to search for information about sites within your selected area.

Job Position: Outreach and Enrollment Specialist

This position will conduct outreach to diverse populations to identify individuals and families in need of health insurance coverage and connect them to the appropriate coverage program through the state ONE system and the Federal Health Insurance exchange. The Outreach and Enrollment Specialist will also build partnerships for referral networks and provide coverage education to partners and community members. In addition, this position will refer clients to other social and medical services as appropriate.

Compensation: \$44,782 to \$47,299 per year, set by NEON's standardized compensation scale. This salaried position is 40 hours per week with full benefits. Relevant experience working in outreach or community-based settings, and strong communication and technology skills are required. Fluency in Spanish, Marshallese, or other second language is preferred.

Low Income Home Water Assistance Program LIHWA

The **Low Income Household Water Assistance Program** provides funding to assist low-income households with water and wastewater bills. **LIHWA** funding can be used to help households restore services for disconnected accounts, prevent disconnections for past due accounts, and reduce rates for current accounts.

- You can either rent or own your home.
