
CELEBRATING 3rd YEAR ANNIVERARY

The Eastern Oregon Community Resource Network is celebrating its 3 year anniversary.

Since launching in the fall of 2020, EOCRN has posted 702 requests asking for needs and sharing resources, 86% of the posts have been for needs and 14% have been shares of materials and information.


62% of requests have been successfully filled while only 15% have been reported as unfulfilled.

12% of the referrals are unknown as there was no response to the follow-ups. 8% of requests were deleted, withdrawn, or referred to another organization. At the time of the report, 3% were current requests waiting to be filled.



REQUESTS SINCE LAUNCHING













Organization affiliations are divided into 8 categories. 36% of members are associated with *Social Services*; followed by 16% *Businesses*; 15% *Government*; 13% *Education*; 12% *Medical*; 4% *Churches*; 4% *Individuals*; and 1% *Service Organizations*. Business and government affiliations have increased in the past year.
