New Features and Updates Coming to EOCRN: Community Events; Emergency Events; and Enhanced "CLOSE REQUEST" Feature

Members will soon be able to view information about community and emergency events in EOCRN. This feature will allow members to share information about an event and request or share available resources related to an emergency or community event.

Emergency event examples include wildfires, snowstorms, floods, droughts, heatwaves, etc. Non-emergency community event examples could include community blood drive; clothes, winter jackets, blanket donations; immunization days or clinics; holiday meals for senior citizens; donate and decorate Christmas trees at a local nursing home; clean up at a local park; help participate in the cleanup of a local river, pond, or lake; volunteer at a soup kitchen; donate old eyeglasses to an organization that collects these and distributes them to people in need; make "care kits" with shampoo, toothbrushes, combs, etc. to donate to homeless shelters; or prepare a home-cooked meal for the residents of a nearby homeless shelter. Look for this feature under the EVENT heading in EOCRN.

The "CLOSE REQUEST" feature has been enhanced. Members can now select more than one member that has helped fulfill a request. These members will be listed in the email notification that is sent out when the request is closed.

How Do I Find Requests/Shares in EOCRN?

All requests/shares are sent out in emails to members based on their profile. Need to find a specific request or share on the EOCRN website?

1. Log in to the site. Look for the green header across the top. Click on **REQUESTS** (third from the left).
2. A drop down menu appears with four choices: NEW REQUEST; OPEN REQUEST; CLOSE REQUEST; CLOSE MULTIPLE REQUEST.
3. Choose **OPEN REQUEST**. All active requests/shares will appear. Details about the request/share, deadline, email for contacting the person submitting the request, and closing an active request/share can be completed from this page.

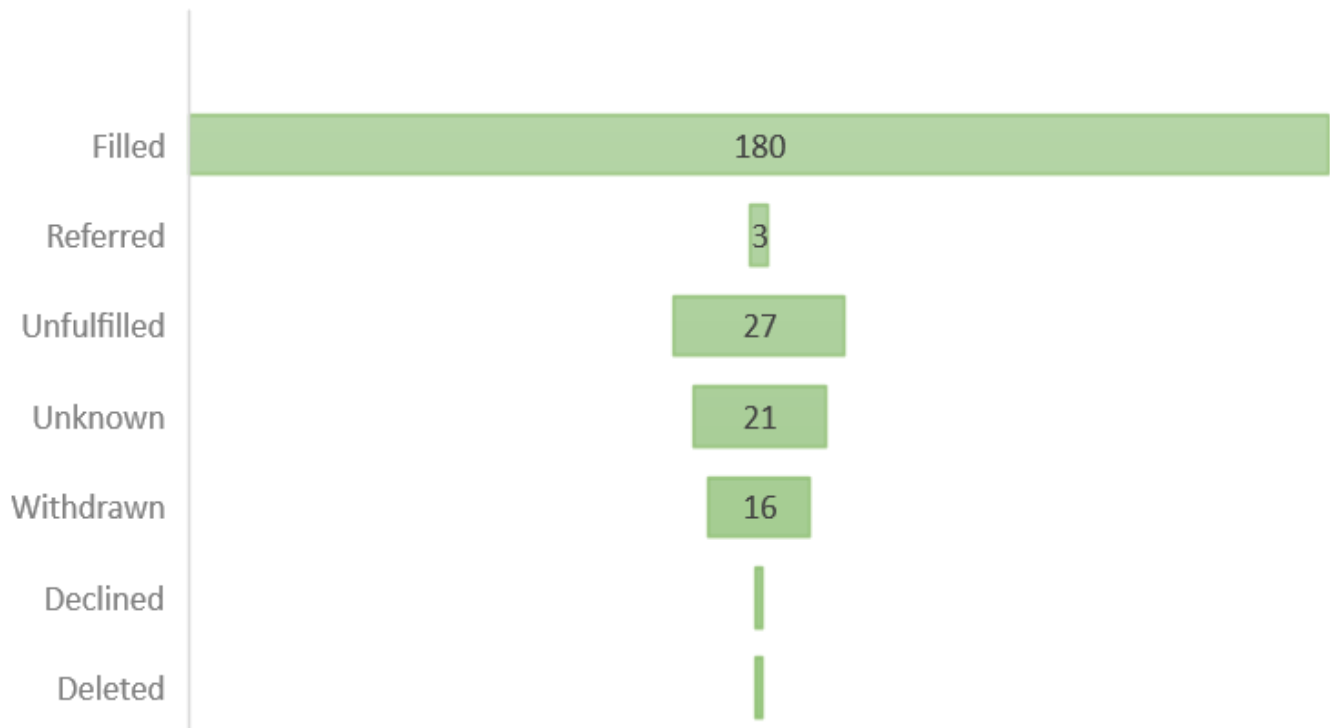
